CELEBRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION UMH P.17 | MUSICAL SETTING A

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

It is right and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth. You are the Deliverer, who led your people of old through the wilderness and brought them into that which you have promised. Guide now the people of your church, that, following our Savior, we may journey through the wilderness of this world toward the glory of the world to come with all your saints. And so, with your people on earth, and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Sanctus: (Sung)

Holy are you and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. He was put to death for our sins and raised for our justification. By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your Church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.
