

## Lighting of the Advent Candle

One: We are on edge daily, wondering what's next, what else will flare up in our lives and in the world. The tug within us to be right and to be on top tends to overpower us. We also live in a time when retaliation and getting even are the order of the day. The news outlets are filled with scenes of wars, weapons of destruction, crumbled buildings, and innocent victims in their paths. When will we be at peace? When will there be peace? Who will bring peace?

All: The Gospel writer reminds us that there is work to be done. "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." In preparing the way, we open paths for our God to come, come to us, come to those who are hurting, come to all peoples. When God comes, peace is experienced and healing is found, but we need to make the way. We need to open the doors of our hearts and lives.

One: So, we light this candle as a sign of our faith and trust that God is not far from us, and that we can clear the way for God to come and dwell with us and give us peace. We light this candle in faith that God loves us and is coming to transform our hearts, our lives, and our world.

Light the second candle on the wreath.

One: Fill us with your peace, Lord.

All: O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.


