Christmas Eve is a celebrated time in the Christian church, and especially here at Saint Mark United Methodist Church. Each year, during all of our Christmas Eve Services, the offering collected goes directly to the ministries of our church. The ministries include our Breakfast and Supper Clubs, where we provide hot meals to many persons who are food insecure and unhoused in the midtown area. Each Saturday, we feed approximately 85 men and women at our Breakfast Club, and over 80 each Tuesday afternoon at our Supper Club. At the end of 2023, we will have fed over eight thousand five hundred men and women. We are able to do this life-saving act of kindness because of your giving.

You will have the opportunity, again during this service to give. And again, your gift will touch the lives of so many. Please know your giving is making a difference in the life of someone in need.




Welcome All!


