One:The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you. One:Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up to the Lord.

One:Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

One:It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, alrighty God, creator of heaven and earth. You took the dust of the earth and breathed your life into it, making all of humanity in your image. ALL of humanity. Because of your act of creation and your breath that lives on in our spirits, everyone is welcome at your table. Since the Ethiopian eunuch's journey from Jerusalem to Gaza until this very day, we have encountered time and again the hurtful stories of persons, eagerly and earnestly seeking after you, who have been excluded from full participation in the ministry and ministries of our church. Yet, you continued to be faithful in loving us. Faithful in sending your prophets throughout the ages to call us to repentance. Faithful in sending leaders to Saint Mark – lay and clergy alike – who have challenged the church to more faithfully reflect your radically inclusive love.

And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:




Current COVID-19 Safety Guidelines
